Statement of Student Achievement Erskine College

The institution evaluates success with respect to student achievement consistent with its mission. Criteria may include: enrollment data; retention, graduation, course completion, and job placement rates; state licensing examinations; student portfolios; or other means of demonstrating achievement of goals. **(Student achievement)** [SACSCOC 4.1]

As expressed within the Erskine College mission statement, the institution seeks "to glorify God as a Christian academic community where **students are equipped to flourish as whole persons**." Erskine has identified several factors to monitor and assess student achievement, including first-to-second year retention, graduation rate, successful course completion, and job or graduate school placement.

First to Second Year Retention

First to second year retention rate refers to freshman students who continue into their sophomore year at Erskine College. Freshman to Sophomore retention held steady from the 2012-2013 to the 2014-2015 academic year but has dropped since and considerably below Erskine's goal of 75% retention. The institution's goal is based on the NCES reported national average. Returning to a level that reaches or exceeds Erskine's goal will take work but is attainable.

Graduation Rate

Graduation rates are computed for students entering as first-time, full-time freshmen undergraduates. Erskine has recently experienced a decline in 6-year graduation rate, but it remains in line with the goal of a 60%. The institution's goal is based on the NCES reported national average.

Course completion is defined as a student earning a passing grade and receiving credit for the course. Erskine's goal for a successful course completion rate is 90%. While not yet reaching the institution's goal, the percentage for 2016-2017 continues to show a growth in course completion rate over the last two years.

Erskine seeks to track student achievement of job placement or entrance into graduate school within the first 12 months after graduation. Erskine's goal is to see 90% of graduates entering the workforce or continuing their education at the graduate level with 12 months of graduation. The percentage for 2016-2017 saw a drastic decrease over the previous year. The institution will need to assess if there are factors leading to the reduction and determine courses of action to improve the percentage. Figures for job and graduate school placement are based on responses to alumni surveys.

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
