

## Assistant or Associate Professor of Psychology (Tenure-Track)

Erskine College invites applications for a tenure-track teaching position in Psychology at the rank of assistant or associate professor. The Department of Psychology and Sociology seeks applicants with degrees in such areas as Behavioral Psychology, Cognitive Psychology, Cultural Psychology, Developmental Psychology, Health Psychology, Human Factors/Engineering Psychology, Industrial/Organizational Psychology, Neuropsychology, Personality Psychology, Positive Psychology, Social Psychology, and Sports Psychology. A Ph.D. or Psy.D. is required, but exceptional ABD candidates with teaching experience may be considered.

This position is anticipated to begin in August 2021. The teaching load is four courses per semester with options for teaching during the summers. Student advising and committee work are expected as well. Applicants must be able to teach General Psychology and other psychology courses from a Christian worldview.

Located in picturesque Due West, South Carolina, Erskine College prides itself on providing a Christian liberal arts education in a small, tight-knit community. Erskine boasts a collegial faculty who develop deep connections with one another. Professors can expect to receive peer mentorship from other faculty members and to pursue opportunities for interdisciplinary collaboration. While there are many opportunities to do research, performance evaluation places greater weight on teaching than research output. Therefore, candidates who seek employment at Erskine College should be professing Christians who are committed to exploring the intersections of faith and learning with students.
