Description

Erskine College is receiving applications for two, full-time faculty positions beginning August 2023. Candidates applying for the Assistant or Associate Professor positions must hold a PhD or EdD in Education. The applicants must have a current teaching license and at least five years teaching experience in a public, private, or charter schools in the United States. Preference will be given to those who can teach a variety of courses preparing K-6 teacher candidates. Additionally, those with undergraduate classroom teaching experience are preferred.

The applicants must:

- Embrace, support, and promote the Erskine College's Christian mission and philosophy of Christian higher education
- Display excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- Show evidence of classroom teaching in K-6 public and/or private schools
- Demonstrate a willingness to partner with local public and/or private schools
- Demonstrate experience in mentoring and/or advising in an educational setting, including evaluating teachers using the ADEPT 4.0 standards
- Hold a certificate of completion in the ADEPT 4.0 instrument evaluator training. Training will be provided if needed.
- Be committed to Erskine College's Conceptual Framework: All teachers should demonstrate captivating leadership, creating instruction, and caring relationships.
- Display knowledge of assessment trends and best practices in assessment of student learning outcomes and program outcomes
- Have experience supervising pre-service teachers in field placements
- Showcase the ability to assume responsibility for tasks with considerable independence
- Possess a knowledge of using online learning platforms and assessment tools. Training will be provided as needed.
- Personal relationship with Jesus Christ as well as a commitment to Erskine's Statement of Faith and Core values.
- Commitment to Erskine's Vision and Mission.

- Provide spiritual guidance, prayer, and support to students and staff.

Other considerations but not essential:

- Have experience with accreditation documents e.g. CAEP accreditation.
- Display knowledge and training in CAEP -Writing and facilitating the CAEP (Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation) accreditation program reports.
- Additionally, according to skills and expertise, the candidate may perform other duties.
