Description

Erskine College (www.erskine.edu) invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor position in the Department of Biology (start date Aug 2026). A broad background in biology and genuine enthusiasm for teaching in an undergraduate Christian liberal arts environment are essential. Previous undergraduate teaching experience is desired. We seek applicants who will complement and expand our existing departmental disciplinary strengths, with current needs particularly in the areas of anatomy, physiology, and other medical or veterinary sciences including developmental biology and neuroscience. Biostatistics is another area of need. Earned Ph.D. or M.D. or DVM by start date is expected, but exceptional ABD candidates will be considered. Applicants with a background in vertebrate zoology or paleontology will be considered.

Responsibilities

Teaching load of 24 credit hours per year, with in-person teaching of lecture and lab. Teaching responsibilities will include introductory biology for science majors or non-majors, senior seminar, and courses in field of specialty. Additional responsibilities include departmental, institutional, and church/community service. Faculty members are expected to embrace and support the Erskine mission statement. - Earned Ph.D. in Biology or related field or M.D. or DVM
- Prior teaching experience at the university level is preferred
- A record of scholarly research with a demonstrated potential for scholarly contributions involving undergraduates in your specialized research field
- Excellent communication skills, both written and verbal, with the ability to engage and inspire students
